The priorities



Lorne Green has listened to many different local people to find out the main things they think the police should do. We call these things **priorities**.

These are the main priorities:



- 1. People should see that the police are working
- We want more people volunteering in policing



 We want more opportunities for people to talk with the police



 The police should work more closely with young people



- Local people should have a chance to decide what the police are doing
- People should know what the police are doing and not be so afraid of crime

2. More help for the country areas



 We should find new ways to work in the country areas



 People in the country areas should understand more about what the police are doing

 People should feel confident to report crimes in the country areas





We will work with other organisations to:

Tackle dangerous driving





 Reduce the number of people killed or injured by crashes

4. Stop people from committing crimes again and again



We will:

Tackle all types of violence and abuse



 Reduce the amount of abuse by family members at home



 Deal with the reasons why people commit crimes again and again



 Increase the support for vulnerable young people

5. Support victims



We will:

- Do more to help victims and witnesses
- Work more with people who are most likely to become victims



A **victim** is someone who has had a crime committed against them.



Improve how we work with people with mental illness



 Help to reduce the number of crimes committed by people who take illegal drugs or drink too much



 Make it easier for people to report things to the police

 Help the police to fight crime in the best way possible



Get better computer systems

Get better at sharing information

7. Good value for money



We will:

 Make sure that the police force spend their money in the best way possible



 We will look at ways that we can get better value for money by working better with other organisations

Checking the police are doing a good job



The Police and Crime Commissioner is responsible for making sure the police follow these priorities.



Lorne Green will have regular meetings with the Chief Constable and ask for reports on the work they are doing.
