## THE RESPECT YOUNG PEOPLE'S PROGRAMME

Are you working with a family experiencing Child to Parent Violence and Abuse?

Looking for an accredited intervention which can make a positive change?

## What is the RYPP programme?

The Respect Young People's Programme (RYPP) was created in 2016 as an intervention for families where children or young people aged between 8 and 18 are abusive or violent towards the people close to them, particularly their parents or carers.

The programme works with young people and their families, encouraging everyone to take a role in stopping the abuse and learning respectful ways of managing conflict and intimacy.

RYPP trained practitioners within Children's Services provide support, insight and simple solutions to families to improve their relationships and reduce violence and abuse over the course of 18 sessions.

Both the young person and their parent/carer must be willing to engage.

The RYPP is proven to help families feel safer and happier at home.
