The Prevent duty: updated guidance for education settings

On the 7th September 2023 the [Prevent duty guidance](#) will be substantively updated for the first time since 2015. Although the updated guidance places **no new legal requirements or additional responsibilities on education settings**, there are changes that the education sector should be aware of.

The updated guidance won't come into effect **until 31st December 2023 at the earliest**.

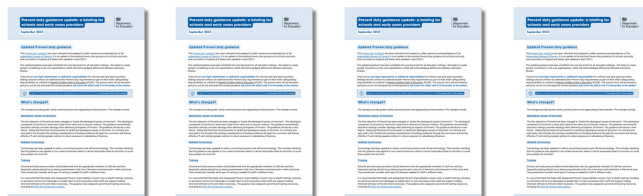

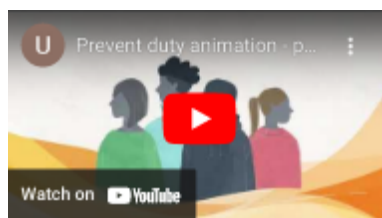

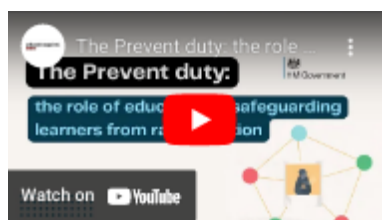


New Prevent video animations
