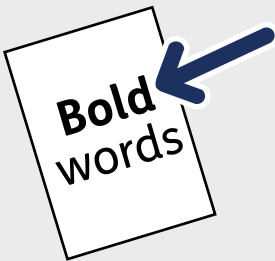

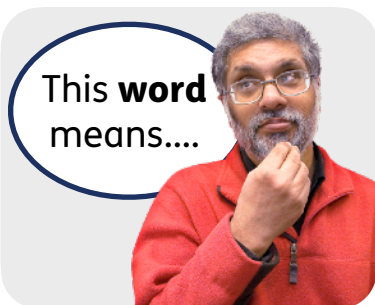
This is an Easy Read version of some information. It may not include all of the information but it will tell you about the important parts.

What do you think?



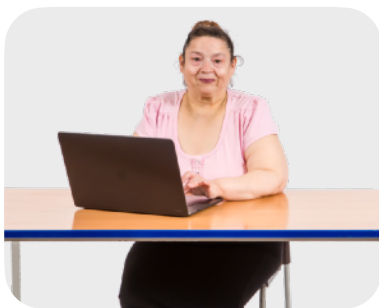
Sarah Taylor wants to know what you think should be most important for police services in Norfolk.

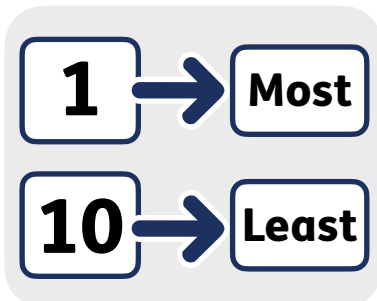

Priority 5: Making streets in Norfolk safer.

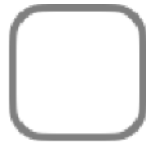

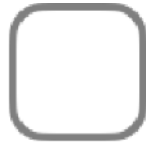

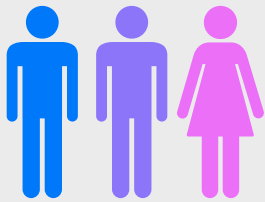
