WHAT IS RESTORATIVE JUSTICE?

The aim of Restorative Justice (RJ) is to repair harm caused by crime by facilitating safe communication between the victim and the offender.

Victims can explain how the incident made them feel, describe the consequences, ask questions, and seek an apology or explanation from the offender.



- Voluntary for all parties
- Risk Assessed
- Tailored
- Allows questions
- Discusses impact
- No time limit
- Safe
- Respectful
