SUBJECT: Funding for the Matthew Project to provide the 180° Norfolk – Link Worker

SUMMARY:

The OPCCN, via Norfolk Constabulary has funded the Norfolk 180° Link Worker for the last two financial years (2014/15 and 2015/16) to support the achievement of the strategic objective to prevent re-offending. A commitment has also been made to fund the post for a further three years until 31 March 2019 (subject to annual review).

To strengthen the governance for the commissioning of the Norfolk 180° Link Worker, the OPCCN is now commissioning directly the provision of the worker from the Matthew Project to apply standard grant terms and conditions. These include a systematic performance review process and annual review of the benefits of the grant.

The Integrated Offender Management (IOM) Link worker will work with individuals on the Norfolk Integrated Offender Management scheme as directed by the IOM Scheme Manager and in line with the National Offender Management Service (NOMS) pathways to reducing re-offending. The work will be performed in accordance with the aims, objectives, policies and procedures of The Matthew Project.

The Link Worker will deliver comprehensive information, support and interventions to the IOM cohort. They will facilitate engagement, signposting, assertive outreach and referral to other services.

The day to day management of the Link Worker will be undertaken by the Police Inspector with overall responsibility for the IOM Scheme across Norfolk and Suffolk. The Matthew Project will be responsible for the employment of the Link Worker, providing line management and all relevant statutory provisions.

The Matthew Project Criminal Justice Manager will be responsible for facilitating regular reviews of service and feedback of service to the IOM Scheme Manager.

DETAIL OF THE SUBMISSION

1. OBJECTIVE:

1.1 To secure continue funding of the IOM Link Worker to work with individuals on the Norfolk IOM Scheme in line with the National Offender Management Services (NOMS) pathways to reduce re-offending.

2. BACKGROUND:

- 2.1 Norfolk and Suffolk's Integrated Offender Management (IOM) scheme brings a crossagency response to the crime and reoffending threats faced by local communities. The most persistent and problematic offenders are identified and managed jointly by partner agencies working together.
- 2.2 IOM helps to improve the quality of life in communities by:
 - reducing the negative impact of crime and reoffending
 - reducing the number of people who become victims of crime
 - helping to improve the public's confidence in the criminal justice system.
- 2.3 The main features of Norfolk and Suffolk's IOM include:
 - partners managing offenders together
 - a local response to local problems
 - all offenders can potentially be included
 - offenders face up to their responsibility or face the consequences
 - best use is made of existing programmes and governance arrangements
 - achieving long-term desistance from crime.
- 2.4 The evidence shows that a key worker approach is a successful way of engaging vulnerable people and their families, and the use of a multi-agency panel is effective in bringing statutory and voluntary organizations together to work to common outcomes.
- 2.5 After engaging with their key worker, Norfolk and Suffolk scheme clients report enhanced skills with respect to recognising risky situations, walking away from arguments, stressful situations or anti-social behaviour; improved family relationships, higher self-esteem and respect for others; and a number re-engage with their communities.
- 2.6 The OPCCN, via Norfolk Constabulary has funded the Norfolk 180° Link Worker for the last two financial years (2014/15 and 2015/16) to support the achievement of the strategic objective to prevent re-offending. A commitment has also been made to fund the post for a further three years until 31 March 2019 (subject to annual review).

3. AREAS FOR CONSIDERATION:

3.1 To strengthen the governance for the commissioning of the Norfolk 180° Link Worker, the OPCCN is now commissioning directly the provision of the worker from the Matthew Project to apply standard grant terms and conditions. These include a systematic performance review process and annual review of the benefits of the grant.

- 3.2 The key outputs of the grant are as follows....
 - Provision of information.
 - · Referrals to support agencies.
 - Outreach activities.
 - Quarterly monitoring reports to the IOM Scheme Manager and the OPCCN, including progress against outputs/outcomes and spend.
 - Annual report on activity/outputs and outcomes of the Link Worker.

4. OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED:

4.1 Withdraw funding for the Link Worker – this option has been rejected due to the adverse impact this would have on the IOM scheme's ability to manage and change the behaviour of prolific offenders in the community to prevent re-offending and victimisation in the future.

5. STRATEGIC AIMS/OBJECTIVE SUPPORTED:

5.1 Local Integrated Offender Management arrangements focus on cutting crime and reducing reoffending and victimisation.

6. FINANCIAL AND OTHER RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS:

6.1 A total of £98,684 will be provided over three year period, broken down as below.
