FUEL CONTRACT TO LASER.

SUMMARY:

The 7 Force Strategic Procurement Governance Board has approved the purchase of heating oil and transport bunker fuel from the 'Laser Energy Buying Group'.

This paper seeks the PCC's authority to proceed.

It is recommended the PCC approves the grant of the fuel purchase contract on a 7 Force basis to Laser.

KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

1. BACKGROUND:

1.1 The route to market to procure future heating oil for buildings and transport bunker fuel has been reviewed by the 7 Force Procurement Department and reported to the 7F Strategic Procurement Governance Board.

1.2 The PCC estimated spend is:

Building heating oil: £16,100 per annum.

The PCC's transport fuel is only for bunkered fuel – limited annual spend unless used in an emergency.

- 1.3 The 7F Procurement Department Gate 1 paper outlined in Appendix A, provides further background.
- 1.4 It is recommended that the PCC signs up to the Laser contract on a 7F basis to seek best value and for Laser to market test the further purchase of oil and transport fuel from suppliers.

2. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

- 2.1 Future savings and costs depend on UK price variations for oil and transport fuel.
- 2.2 The Laser consortium will seek best value via bulk procurement and market testing.

3. OTHER IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS:

3.1 The usual risks apply to oil and fuel supplies via national and global market conditions
