

Subject: Norfolk Community Law Service – Domestic Abuse Support Service

Summary:

- Norfolk Community Law Service has provided free legal advice and support to domestic abuse (DA) victims under the current grant agreement since 1 April 2022. The current grant arrangement ends on 31 March 2025.
- 2. The service provides specialist legal support through the courts to survivors/victims where there is financial difficulty.
- 3. The service helps DAvictims/survivors to access legal remedies in civil and family courts these remedies provide protection and reduce risks to victims/survivors and their children.
- 4. This decision notice is to award Norfolk Community Law service grant funding of £35000 for the period 1 April 2025 31 March 2026.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the PCC support this decision notice for further funding of the legal advice service for DAvictims/survivors delivered by Norfolk Community Law Service for further year 1 April 2025 – 31 March 2026.

Detail of the submission

1. Objective:

- 1.1 The aim of this project is to ensure that people experiencing domestic abuse and financial difficulty can access legal remedies which reduce the risks to them and their families.
- 1.2 This decision notice is to award Norfolk Community Law Service £35000 funding for the financial year 2025/26 (1 April 2025 31 March 2026).

2. Background:

- 2.1 The NCLS service provides valuable advice and support to ensure that people experiencing financial difficulty can access appropriate legal advice and support when going through civil and family court processes.
- 2.2 Legal remedies such as non-molestation orders, occupation orders and prohibitive steps orders play a key part in safeguarding and reducing the risk to DAto victims/survivors and their children.
- 2.3 The service is filling a gap in Norfolk as result of lack of legal aid solicitors available to provide free support.

3. Areas for consideration:

3.1 This is a reduction in funding from previous years – the new service will be able to provide support up to 200 clients per year.

4. Other options considered:

- 4.1 Not funding the service this would mean that there would be a lack of free legal advice for DA victims and survivors in Norfolk this option has been rejected.
- 4.2 Continuing to fund current service provision this would incur additional costs this option was rejected.
- 4.3 To provide £35000 funding for 1 April 2025 31 March 2026 with a reduction in service to support up to 200 clients during the funding period.

5. Strategic aims/objective supported:

- 5.1 The PCC has a statutory obligation to set out Police and Crime objectives through the Police, Crime and Community Safety Plan 2022-2024. The PCC's six priorities fall into the following categories each with detailed objectives in the plan:
 - Sustain Norfolk Constabulary
 - Visible and Trusted Policing
 - Tackling Crime
 - Prevent Offending
 - Support Victims
 - Safe and Stronger Communities
- 5.2 The NCLS DA Support Project supports three of these pillars: Prevent Offending, Supporting Victims and Safe and Stronger Communities.

6. Financial and other resource implications:

- 6.1 The total funding is £35000
- 6.2 The breakdown of funding is as follows:
