Freedom of Information Request FOI/OPCCN/142 – Outcome of Internal Review

Thank you for your Internal Review request dated 19th May 2018 regarding a Freedom of Information Request in which you asked for:

“Dear Norfolk Police and Crime Commissioner,

Please provide the register of premises or land owned by, or occupied for the purposes of, the office of Police and Crime Commissioner, and the functions of their force, for the financial year 2017/18.

Entries listed should be broken down by local policing directorate (or borough), and indicate whether it is:

**Police building
Other building/land
Neighbourhood office
Other**

The purpose of an Internal Review is to assess how your Freedom of Information request was handled in the first instance and to determine whether the original decision given to you was correct. This is an independent review and I was not involved in the original decision.

The response to you on 19th April 2018 is outlined below:

“In respect of the Freedom of Information request we would advise that this information is not held by the OPCCN but may be held by Norfolk Constabulary as the Police and Crime Commissioner’s estate is managed, maintained, and improved by the Estate’s Department of Norfolk Constabulary on behalf of the PCC.

Could you please confirm you are happy for us to transfer this request to the Freedom of Information Unit at Norfolk Constabulary for their attention.”

DECISION:

I have assessed your case and after careful consideration, I have concluded that the initial response that was sent to you was not compliant with the requirements of the Freedom of Information Act.

As you have highlighted in your response to us dated 19th May 2018, this is a legally required document to be published annually by the OPCC. This information should have been obtained and sent to you and then published on the website. This has now been rectified and I have attached the hyperlink below that will provide you with access to this information:
