#### SUBJECT:

Substance Misuse and Alcohol Fund

#### SUMMARY:

In August 2014, the PCC established the Substance Misuse and Alcohol Fund from the PCC's wider commissioning budget.

The Fund aims to support those voluntary sector and community-based organisations that provide support to Norfolk residents affected by problematic drug and alcohol use and those working to reduce the impact of substance misuse and alcohol related harm on the wider community.

Organisations were able to bid for grants of between £1,000 - £40,000 per year.

There was scope for continued funding to a maximum of three years, however short term bids were encouraged. Offers for three-year funding would be in-principle, and subject to satisfactory monitoring which would be reviewed at the end of each year. Where relevant bids were for multi-year funding organisations needed to include plans to sustain the activity going forward.

- A total of 24 bids for funding were received.
- On 30<sup>th</sup> October 2014, the Substance Misuse and Alcohol Panel met to review each application against the PCC's priorities.
- The funding pot was originally set at £200,000.
- Due to the exceptional standard of applications, the Panel recommended the PCC to fund more organisations in excess of the original funding pot, that met his Priorities.
- This will require an increase of £29,548.50 in funding to enable a total of £229,548.50 to be allocated to 13 groups.

A breakdown of the funds allocated and which organisations received them is set out in Appendix 1.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the PCC endorse the allocation of funds of £229,548.50 to 13 organisations, as recommended by the Substance Misuse and Alcohol Panel of the Safer Norfolk Foundation Medium Grant Programme.

#### DETAIL OF THE SUBMISSION

#### 1. KEY ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION:

- 1.1 Section 9 of the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011 sets out that a Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) may make a Crime and Disorder Reduction Grant to any person. A Crime and Disorder Reduction Grant is a grant which in the opinion of the PCC, will secure, or contribute to securing, crime and disorder reduction in the PCC's Local Policing Area. The PCC may make the Crime and Disorder Reduction Grant, subject to any conditions, which the PCC thinks appropriate. The PCC's Crime and Disorder Reduction Objectives are set out within the Police and Crime Plan.
- 1.2 In August 2014, the PCC established the Substance Misuse and Alcohol Fund from the PCC's wider commissioning budget.

The Fund aimed to support those voluntary sector and community-based organisations that provide support to Norfolk residents affected by problematic drug and alcohol use and those working to reduce the impact of substance misuse and alcohol related harm on the wider community.

- 1.4 A breakdown of the funds allocated and which organisations received them is indicated in Appendix 1.

#### 2. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

2.1 The bids received during the first round were very strong and as a result of this, the initial £200,000 funding pot was increased to £229,548.50. The additional funding can be met from the Commissioning budget.
