**53%** in favour of 2% rise : **47%** for a freeze

In addition there were telephone responses from 3 people, all of which supported a freeze. Although these 3 would not have made a difference to the overall result, one of the calls was from a North Walsham resident on behalf of 39 neighbours who voted for the freeze. Including all of the 42 telephone votes would made the totals 538 for; 521 against, which would bring the total to 51% for 49% against. There were also 4 forms completed incorrectly – if included the figures would still be 51%:49%
