



- 13% reduction from previous year with five year downward trend of 34% from 3809 to 2506.
- Most categories have reduced over the last year although groups congregating in public areas has shown a 12% increase.
 The bus station has had a reduction of groups congregating and the nearby
 Tesco and McDonalds have seen an increase. This may be a dispersal effect.
- Drunken behaviour in the district is down by 18%.

- Two year data tables show crime increasing, with violence the largest contributor.
- Violence has been increasing steadily over the last three years, as well as sexual offences.
 This is a national trend.
- Factors influencing this can include continuing improvement in crime recording practices and greater propensity amongst the public to report crimes.
- Burglary has reduced this year by 17% (or 127 offences).
- 17% increase in domestic offences which is likely to reflect a greater willingness to report.
- Hate crime has decreased by 15% this year from 325 offences to 276 offences.
- 86 police officers were assaulted this year, an increase of 9%.

 Arrests for possession and supply of drugs have increased by 14%, largely due to proactive patrols aimed at dealers. Cannabis is the largest increase in drug type.

Possession of knives has increased by 35%.
 This is a recognised national trend, which is being addressed by additional patrols and education of targeted groups. This is increase is volatile due to the low number of offences.

 There have been 649 reports of missing people in the last three months. 89 of which were reported more than once across this period. One missing person had 47 individual missing reports in this period.
